# LEVEL 1





Level 1 cadets are exposed to all elements of the Air Cadet program. They receive instruction on basic drill and aviation, how to maintain their uniform, basic survival, air rifle practices and the importance of teamwork. They participate in a variety of squadron events to find their interests to excel in future years.

#### LEVEL 2





Cadets in Level 2 further explore aspects of the Air Cadet Program. They begin to excel at drill and uniform components, demonstrate effective teamwork and begin to learn the basics of leadership, build upon aviation knowledge and recognize their talents within the squadron. They prepare to become outstanding leaders in future years.

# LEVEL 3

Level 3 is often the cadets' first experience in a leadership role, showing leadership in various positions. The cadets are evaluated on their drill, instructional and leadership abilities and aviation knowledge, even having the opportunity to run the squadron for a night.



#### LEVEL 4



Cadets in Level 4 are heavily tested on their drill and discipline, aviation knowledge, instructional and leadership abilities. They often shadow Level 5 cadets to better prepare for their role the next training year and aim to inspire younger cadets in the squadron.

### LEVEL 5

Level 5 cadets play a crucial role in 8 Globemaster's success. They are instructors, mentors to flights and levels and plan and execute events and training exercises. The seniors aim to promote the Air Cadet program to younger cadets and guide them to become better leaders.
