# REVIEWING OFFICER PROFILE



Major David A. Wright, CD  
Deputy Commanding Officer,  
Regional Cadet Support Unit  
Central

Born in Scarborough on 21 October 1971, Major Wright was raised in Toronto where, in 1984, he joined Air cadets with 666 Squadron (later redesignated 166 Bulldog Squadron). High points of his cadet service included the Vehicle Technician Course (1987), two summers as a staff cadet in Trenton (1988 & 1990), meeting H.R.H. the Duke of Edinburgh as an award recipient, and earning his pilot wings in London (1989). He achieved the cadet rank of Warrant Officer Second Class, and briefly held the appointment of Squadron Warrant Officer in his last weeks at the squadron.

Upon graduation from the French Immersion program at York Mills Collegiate Institute in 1990, Major Wright began studies in the Faculty of Science at the University of Waterloo. There, he volunteered with 822 Tutor Squadron, became a civilian instructor, and was enrolled as an officer in May 1991. He completed his Basic Officer Qualification that spring, and spent the first of many summers as an officer at TACC. Over the next five years,

Major Wright completed the required officer development courses, as well as several specialty courses; he occupied most positions on the squadron staff but primarily served as Training Officer and Squadron Familiarization Pilot. He also served as an instructor at the Regional Cadet Instructor Schools in both Central and Eastern Regions and returned each summer to Trenton on staff for the Air Studies Course.

After graduating from university with a major in Psychology, Major Wright spent ten months working in the United Kingdom and travelling throughout Europe. Returning to Canada, he began employment as a Child and Youth Worker at a Young Offender facility in Waterloo.

With his promotion to Captain in September 1996, he transferred to 296 City of Cambridge Squadron, serving as Training Officer, Administration Officer, and Deputy Commanding Officer. He returned to Trenton (TACSTC) for the summer as Standards Officer in 1996, and officer commanding the Introduction to Aviation Course in 1998 & 1999. In 2001 he was appointed to the full-time position of Area Cadet Officer for Eastern Ontario and moved to Trenton. Then in 2003, he was posted to the Regional Cadet Support Unit (RCSU) in Borden, Ontario, as the Regional Air Training Officer, a position he held for six years. While in Borden, Major Wright completed his Bachelor of Education degree from Brock University. During the summers of 2007 and 2008, he was attached in the rank of Major as Chief Instructor at TACSTC. On 21 May 2009, he was appointed Deputy Commanding Officer of TACSTC and moved back to Trenton in June 2009. On 1 October 2009, he assumed command of the training centre, and served as an Acting Lieutenant-Colonel for three summers. He was posted back to Borden on 1 April 2013 and assumed the duties of Plans Officer at RCSU Central. In a re-organization of the RCSU, Major Wright became Deputy Chief Training Officer on 1 April 2016. He then served as RCSU Chief of Staff from June 2017 to May 2019, responsible for RCSU HQ operations, and oversight of administrative, finance, and support services. After leading a one-year national special project, he returned as Operations and Plans Officer until 1 May 2022 when he was appointed Deputy Commanding Officer of the Region.

In addition to flying, Major Wright enjoys cycling, sailing, and camping, as well as other outdoor pursuits; he is also an avid SCUBA diver. He is married to the former Michelle Wanklin of Kitchener, Ontario, and together they have three children: Gillian (2005), Benjamin (2007), and Natalie (2010).
